One of the shining stars of this program is Nova, a bright and creative sixthgrader who, after completing her initial Educational Development Plan in Xello, learned she "matched" in a career pathway in writing and design. Her journey into the world of graphic design and author/illustration began when she signed up for Middle School CTC with curiosity and excitement.



With the guidance of experienced instructors at the CTC, the inspiration of published author, Kelly Baptist, and access to professional-grade design tools, she began to bring her ideas to life. As she dived deeper into the program, Nova discovered a passion for graphic design and author/illustration that she never knew existed. She embarked on projects that ultimately led to her creating her own book and teaching the writing process and creation of her book to family and community members during the final Exhibition of Learning.

She gained essential skills such as problem-solving, critical thinking, and effective communication as she shared her ideas with her peers, her family, and community members. The top 2 classes from each village were: Mr. Simila and Mrs. Lewis from the Blue Village; Mrs. McMullin and Mrs. Campbell


from the Green Village; and Mrs. Crowell and Mrs. Hernandez from the Red Village. Each class will receive an ice cream party.
